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A teacher of Jewish law.

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


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Torah

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The Five Books of Moses: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy.

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skull cap

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A cap that covers the head, during prayer, eating and studying.

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Star of David

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Known as the shield of David, this is a well known symbol of Judaism.

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


Kippah

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A cap that covers the head, during prayer, eating and studying.

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


Kippot

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Tallit

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Worn on top of your clothes in the synagogue, especially during Sabbath.

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Shabbat

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The seventh day of the Jewish week, which is a day of rest and is often used for prayer.


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Hannukkah

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The Jewish festival of lights, traditionally celebrated in November or December.



menorah

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A nine branched candle lit during the eight-day holiday of Hanukkah.

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


seder plate

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A plate on which the symbolic foods of the seder are placed, including lamb, bitter herbs, roasted egg and horseradish.

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


celery

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Eaten at Passover as part of the karpas (vegetables), celery is dipped in salt water at the start of the meal.

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etrog

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A yellow citrus fruit used during the week-long holiday of Sukkot, a holiday marking the end of harvest time.

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


dreidel

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A Jewish gambling toy with a letter of the Hebrew alphabet on each side meaning "a great miracle happened there."

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horseradish

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Eaten at Passover, this is a bitter herb to remind Jews of the bitterness of slavery endured by their ancestors.

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


matzos

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Taken during Passover, this is a cracker type of bread made without yeast. It was created when Jews had to flee Egypt.

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


lamb

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Eaten during Passover to remember the sacrifice made the night the ancient Hebrews fled Egypt.

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


parsley

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Eaten during Passover to remember the sacrifice made the night the ancient Hebrews fled Egypt.

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roasted egg

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Eaten at Passover as a symbol of the sacrificial offering performed in the days of the Second Temple.

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wine

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Taken during Passover, traditionally four cups are present to represent the four biblical promises of redemption.

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


prayer

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The Torah refers to prayer as “the service of the heart,” an act of love and reverence towards God.

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


synagogue

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A Jewish place of worship, prayer, a place of study and sometimes a community centre.

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Passover
